Collect:

God of compassion,
whose Son Jesus Christ, the child of Mary,
shared the life of a home in Nazareth,
and on the cross drew the whole human family to
himself:

strengthen us in our daily living
that in joy and in sorrow
we may know the power of your presence
to bind together and to heal;
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

God of love,
passionate and strong,
tender and careful:
watch over us and hold us
all the days of our life;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Principal Readings:

1st Reading: *1 Samuel 1: 20-end*

In due time Hannah conceived and bore a son. She named him Samuel, for she said, 'I have asked him of the Lord.'

The man Elkanah and all his household went up to offer to the Lord the yearly sacrifice, and to pay his vow. But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband, 'As soon as the child is weaned, I will bring him, that he may appear in the presence of the Lord, and remain there for ever; I will offer him as a nazirite for all time.' Her husband Elkanah said to her, 'Do what seems best to you, wait until you have weaned him; only—may the Lord establish his word.' So the woman remained and nursed her son, until she weaned him. When she had weaned him, she took him up with her, along with a three-year-old bull, an ephah of flour, and a skin of

wine. She brought him to the house of the Lord at Shiloh; and the child was young. Then they slaughtered the bull, and they brought the child to Eli. And she said, 'Oh, my lord! As you live, my lord, I am the woman who was standing here in your presence, praying to the Lord. For this child I prayed; and the Lord has granted me the petition that I made to him. Therefore I have lent him to the Lord; as long as he lives, he is given to the Lord.'

She left him there for the Lord.

2nd Reading: *Colossians 3: 12-17*

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Gospel: *Luke 2: 33-35*

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

Reflection from Morag

This past year of restrictions has brought opportunities that give hope for the future. One example is the local Mutual Aid group and the recent news that it plans to set up a permanent Community Hub on Symn Lane in Wotton.

Caring for one another crosses all boundaries - think of Captain Sir Tom Moore whose example of helping encouraged people of all ages to give their time to help others.

On Mothering Sunday we thank God for mothers and for all people who have had a hand in mothering and in caring for others. But we also remember that for centuries this was the day when people returned to their mother church - the place where they were baptised and received into the family of God. Each of our local churches is a place where people care for each other and are encouraged to live more like Christ.

In his letter to the Colossian Christians, Paul addresses them as 'God's chosen ones, holy and beloved'. Let that

sink deep into our hearts for we too are God's chosen ones, holy and beloved.

Paul states various attributes for such people - values by which they should live. Anyone connected with schools knows that each school has to state their values.

Examples in our local schools include - respect, hope, responsibility, perseverance, generosity. Schools aim to be a place where such values can be lived and can be seen by others.

Christians, writes Paul, are to clothe themselves with the values of compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, patience and above all, with love. The actual clothes we wear can be a conscious reflection of who we are.

Similarly the values we live by let others see that we are God's chosen ones, holy and beloved; we are people who follow Jesus, and this is what Jesus asks of us: Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength; and love your neighbour as yourself. Amen
