How good it was to see the Lounge at Dryleaze House so full of people for the Easter Saturday Club afternoon; not only residents from Dryleaze House and Court but folk from the local community as well as members of the United Church congregation. A great friendly atmosphere.

Those with birthdays in April were remembered with cards and Easter mementos and prayers were said and get well wishes sent to friends who were known to be unwell.

The main part of the afternoon was Rev. Phil Summers refreshing retelling of the Easter story, various events leading up to the Crucifixion of Jesus and the subsequent happenings at the tomb where he was buried. We were reminded that the disciples and other followers of Jesus were ordinary, humble men and women who were mystified and probably frightened by the unexpected events that engulfed them. Did they find it difficult to understand? 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### Dagoretti Corner Street Children Programmme

We would like to invite you to join the Charity's 2-year sponsorship Scheme

The charity was formed in 2004 and owns an acre of land in Riruta, a deprived suburb of Nairobi near Dagoretti Corner. Living accommodation has been built with electricity, running water, shower and toilet facilities.

Currently this has been home for 9 young men aged between 20 and 25 years for upwards of 10 years.



The work is funded by individuals in the UK, specific fund-raising events and by regular donations from Wotton Baptist Church. All money is used directly in the charity, none being taken out for trustees' expenses. Currently, without support from the UK, activities would cease quickly leaving the young men no choice but to disrupt their education and probably return to a life on the streets.

In a recent edition of 'together in Wotton' the proposed development of the site was reported. Final selection of the development is still to be made but it will probably consist of around 160 apartments. This is a major step for the charity which should provide an income and so establish the work for the long term.

UK funding will still be needed to support the current 9 people to the end of their education. We anticipate this will take a maximum of two years. We would then expect any further costs to be met from income the charity receives from the development project.

Basic costs for each young man average about £165 per month covering food, clothing, and education.

The trustees have launched a one-off 2-year sponsorship scheme offering people the opportunity to help support those costs for one or more of the young men until the end of their education.
