We have seen plenty about Ofsted in the news recently and, at Blue Coat Primary School, we have seen even more of them in person. We were inspected at the end of the Spring term. More recently, we were able to release the published report to parents.

Our experience was a positive one. We received high grades and we are very proud of the accomplishments of the school. The overall grades that we received were:

This gives Blue Coat Primary School an **Overall Effectiveness grade of Good** overall.

During our visit, the inspectors were professional and mindful of their potential impact on our workload and on our wellbeing. They praised our "broad and ambitious curriculum", our "exceptional personal development" and the caring relationships between children. In a short period of time they gained a great deal of insight into the school but, of course, they could not capture all of the wonderful things that happen here. My personal insight from the experience is just what an exceptional team we have here at Blue Coat. Staff, Governors, parents, children and the community all contributed to the success.

We have not been resting on our laurels and continue to work on ways to improve further the experience that the children have here. Mrs Blaken has recently organized for the school to take part in "Farm School". This is where a small number of children visit a local farm in order to experience how farms work. The children have been utterly enthralled when learning about growing crops, pond dipping, meeting the sheep and collecting eggs from the chickens. It has been a pleasure to take the children and see how much they enjoy the experience.

Our Year 6 children have recently completed their SATs assessments. As ever, they were a credit to themselves and to the school. We put on a special breakfast for the week in order to make the week as fun as possible. We will not receive the results for

some time but that does not get in the way of being incredibly proud of the effort that they put into their exams and school in general.

The Servant King

The Coronation of King Charles III is all over and done with. For most of us it was the first Coronation we have experienced and for many it will be the only one.

Looking back (if you can) to his Mother, she famously said in her 21st birthday speech in 1947 that: I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong. We see these sentiments echoed in Charles' own commitment to service to other, to us, and at a time when more folk question the relevance of the monarchy, it is this service that will redeem them,

Having been given a holiday on the Monday following the coronation, we were encouraged to take part in The Big Help. To do something on that day for our communities. Obviously the idea was that links would be forged and people would realise the value of both giving and receiving help from others, and continue when all the bunting had been put away.

But I don't want to go on about Charles III. 'together in Wotton' is about Christians in Wotton and Christian life and service, so we look past Charles to the greater; the greatest Servant King.

Most of us will have sung the worship song of that name, written by Graham Kendrick, but take another look at the words below.

As I prepare 'tiW' each month I am aware of how few in-church meetings and activities there seem to be. I console myself with the thought that this is because we are already outside, and serving our community.

On Kendrick's own website he says: 'It was a challenge to explore the vision of Christ as the servant who would wash the disciples' feet but who was also the Creator of the universe.'

We are not going to be creating any universes, but we can find plenty of feet to wash!
