As we journey towards Christmas this Advent season, Blue Coat staff and pupils will be joyfully preparing lines, costumes and songs for the Christmas Nativity Plays. Our younger pupils will be performing an 'Out of the Ark' musical called 'The Inn-spectors'. The play has lots of humour and is taken from the unusual perspective of examining the condition of the stable by a team of inn-spectors who are not impressed to say the least! They consider it a health and safety nightmare ...is the stable fit for visitors and a newborn baby King? The play develops and follows the main characters as they try to convince the in-spectors that the stable is fit for purpose!

St. Mary's church will once again be the place where our school community gathers to rejoice in Jesus' birth and our Junior children will deliver a more traditional service full of readings, carols and drama sketches. We are hoping that Rev'd Lesley's 'Sidney Scarecrow' will make another appearance!

Across the school RE lessons, Collective Worships and Open the Book, will focus on the core concept of Incarnation. We will be looking closely at The New Testament and how it presents Jesus as the answer — the Messiah and Saviour, who will repair the effects of sin and the Fall and offer a way for humans to be at one with God again. The concept that Jesus is God in the flesh is a challenging one for children (and adults!) to grasp but you would be amazed at how well children can articulate their curiosity and understanding. Rev'd Lesley, Rev's Phil and Rev'd Tom will put claim to this as during their visits to school they are asked some deep and meaningful questions about faith and life!

Each year we build on previous knowledge and by the time pupils reach Year Six they:

UNDERSTAND the text of the Christmas story in the Bible DISCOVER what Christians do at Christmas and where EXPLORE our local churches to find out how Christians worship LEARN why Jesus came to us as the 'Light of the World'

In Gaza, Christian and Muslim Palestinians celebrate Christmas together

- So read a headline in Arab News dated 24 December 2022.

At that time About 1,300 Christians, both Greek Orthodox and Latin Catholic, were living in the Gaza Strip. Greek Orthodox Christians celebrate the birth of Christ on 7 January; Latin Catholic Christians on 25 December. These two days are considered official holidays in all public and private institutions. Hamas, it reports, forbids the public observance of Christmas, but has allowed private celebrations in Christian homes and institutions.



The article continues: Christmas trees are available in some shops, as well as decorations, which are bought by Christians and Muslims alike. "Most of my customers for Christmas decorations are Muslims," shop owner Mahmoud Al-Haij told Arab News.

"My children love the Christmas tree and the lights on it," one customer told Arab News. "We are Muslims, but this time is a time of joy and I want my children to feel it as it is the case in many countries of the world. I have Christian friends in my workplace. We celebrate Christmas together, as well as Eid Al-Fitr, and Eid Al-Adha. We are one people."
