What does it mean to belong to a Faith Community?

This term in RE our Y1/2 children have been exploring the themes of 'Belonging' and 'Faith Communities'. We've been fortunate enough to have three very willing and very talented volunteers visiting our classes to help us learn more about Infant Baptism and the ways of knowing that all people are important to God.

Alan Bell from St. Mary's Church gave us a fun and interactive demonstration of Infant Baptism, whereby children were invited up to the front to act out the service. We heard about the promises that parents and Godparents make and listened to the prayers to bless the baby as he began his Christian journey. 'Simon' was a very well behaved baby... he didn't cry once!

Our children asked some good questions showing great interest and curiosity:

- How many crosses are put on the baby's head?
- Does it matter what the baby wears?
- Do they put oil in the water? * Can it be outside? Can it be anywhere?
- Does it matter what colour the skin is? * How long does it take to be baptised?
- How long do they hold them under water? (this child was remembering the visit to the Baptist Church when Rev'd Tom showed him the Baptismal Pool).







To further support the Y1/2 children in their understanding of 'What does it mean to Belong to a Faith Community?', we were also pleased to welcome Karen Dover from Wotton Baptist Church. Karen performed the story of 'The Woman at the Well' John 4:4-42 to a captivated audience of 90, six and seven year olds! The story reinforces the central themes from the Gospels; Jesus cares for everyone, regardless of their social standing. A strong and important message for us to carry within our hearts. This beautifully linked to our school Christian Vision of 'Love your neighbour as you love yourself'. Like the woman in the story, Karen echoed the excitement of sharing the 'Good News' of Jesus.





The legacy of Rev'd Phil Summers lives on through Jane Gray Wallis! Jane from Wotton United Church, enjoys re-enacting Bible stories with children who attend our after school Christian Club 'Ignite'. Inspired by Phil, Jane brings the stories to life, encouarging our young people to seek out the messages and make parallels with their own lives. We do love Jane's visits to Ignite Club!


Father Richard (The Salvatorian UK Provincial) is working hard to get us a permanent priest.
