


Everyone had the opportunity to give their opinion on recent events; the World Day of Prayer Service; Lent House Groups and the Easter events – Walk of Witness (and Hot Cross Buns) and Sunrise Service (and breakfast). More recently, the VE80 and Peace Prayer event and Christian Aid Week. Most of these 'happen' every year, but we always need to ask if they are still relevant and can we do different or better.

We continued by looking ahead. It hasn't been possible to make arrangements for a United Service at the start of June, but we are now looking at a provisional date of Sunday 6 July when we would have a morning Service followed by a barbecue. All to be confirmed!

We all agreed that we want to be able to work as Christians with the community, in the community and for the community. 

Praying for the Churches

This month it's Holy Cross

On a world-wide scale, last month we gave thanks for the life and witness of Pope Francis. Now we can pray for the new leader of the Catholic Church! Kate Barlow has sent me the below and says: 'We are all delighted to have a new Pope and positive about the future with him'

As thousands gathered in Vatican Square on Thursday 8 May, with countless millions watching worldwide, the senior cardinal Dominique Mamberti came out on the balcony of St Peter's Basilica to announce that Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost had been elected the 267th successor to St Peter on the fourth Conclave vote.

Cardinal Prevost has taken the name Leo, and as Pope Leo XIV he becomes the chief pastor and shepherd to the universal church, some 1.4 billion Catholics across the world. We should never underestimate or take for granted the work of the Holy Spirit alive in our Church and in our world. Cardinal Prevost was hardly mentioned during the build-up to the Conclave and the voting for Pope Francis's successor was not expected to be over so soon, but here we are – the new Bishop of Rome, the first from North America with dual Peruvian nationality. We rejoice and are glad that we have a new leader for our time, someone who will look to build unity and bridges within the Church and across our troubled world.

Bishop Bosco of our Clifton Diocese has provided a message on the election of Pope Leo XIV (abridged): "In his first words to the world, Pope Leo XIV greeted us with the timeless blessing: "Peace be with you all." He reminded us that this was the first greeting of the Risen Christ, the Good Shepherd, who gave His life for the flock of God. He expressed his desire for this peace to enter our hearts, reach our families, and extend to all people, everywhere on earth.

O Holy Spirit, strengthen our new Pope, guide him in wisdom and peace, and bless the Church he now leads.




