

Exciting times as Blue Coat prepares to implement a new RE syllabus

Gloucestershire Standing Advisory Council on RE (SACRE) have for the past few years been closely following the national developments in RE. Research suggests that most young people are growing up without any religious component in their upbringing, and many of them are non-religious. Times are changing and new approaches to the teaching and learning of RE are imperative if we want to prepare our children for modern day Britain. The Commission on Religious Education recommended a "Religion and Worldviews approach to Religious Education" in schools, a "worldview" being any of the diverse ways in which religious and non-religious people "encounter, interpret, understand, and engage with the world", recognising that world-views can be organised, such as an institutional religion, or can be personal. The report which was published in 2018 has helped SACRE develop and shape a new syllabus that embraces a Religion and Worldviews approach. The new Primary RE syllabus retains its emphasis on examining four religious worldviews (Christianity, Hinduism, Judaisam and Islam), alongside non-religious worldviews held by pupils. Humanism, as an example of an organised nonreligious worldview, is given more space in the 2025 syllabus. The curriculum also continues to offer open, enquiring. exploratory RE, suitable for all pupils, whether their personal worldviews are religious or non-religious, or a more complex jigsaw of elements of both. The 2025 syllabus is forward thinking, providing an academic and knowledge-rich understanding of faith and belief in modern Britain which allows them to engage meaningfully with their own beliefs, as well as others'. In the words of SACRE:

'The principal aim for religious education in Gloucestershire is

for pupils to understand how worldviews influence people's lives, including their own, through the study of religious and nonreligious worldviews, so that they better understand themselves and the world around them, and become better equipped to contribute to and flourish in society.'

As a RE Hub Leader for the Diocese of Gloucester, I have had the pleasure of helping shape the new syllabus and worked alongside Debbie Helme, Principle Advisor of the Gloucester Diocesan Board of Education, and Stephen Pett, National RE Adviser, and author of the Gloucestershire RE Syllabus. It has been and will continue to be an exciting journey. A journey which ensures that our young people have access to high quality religious education in Gloucestershire.
